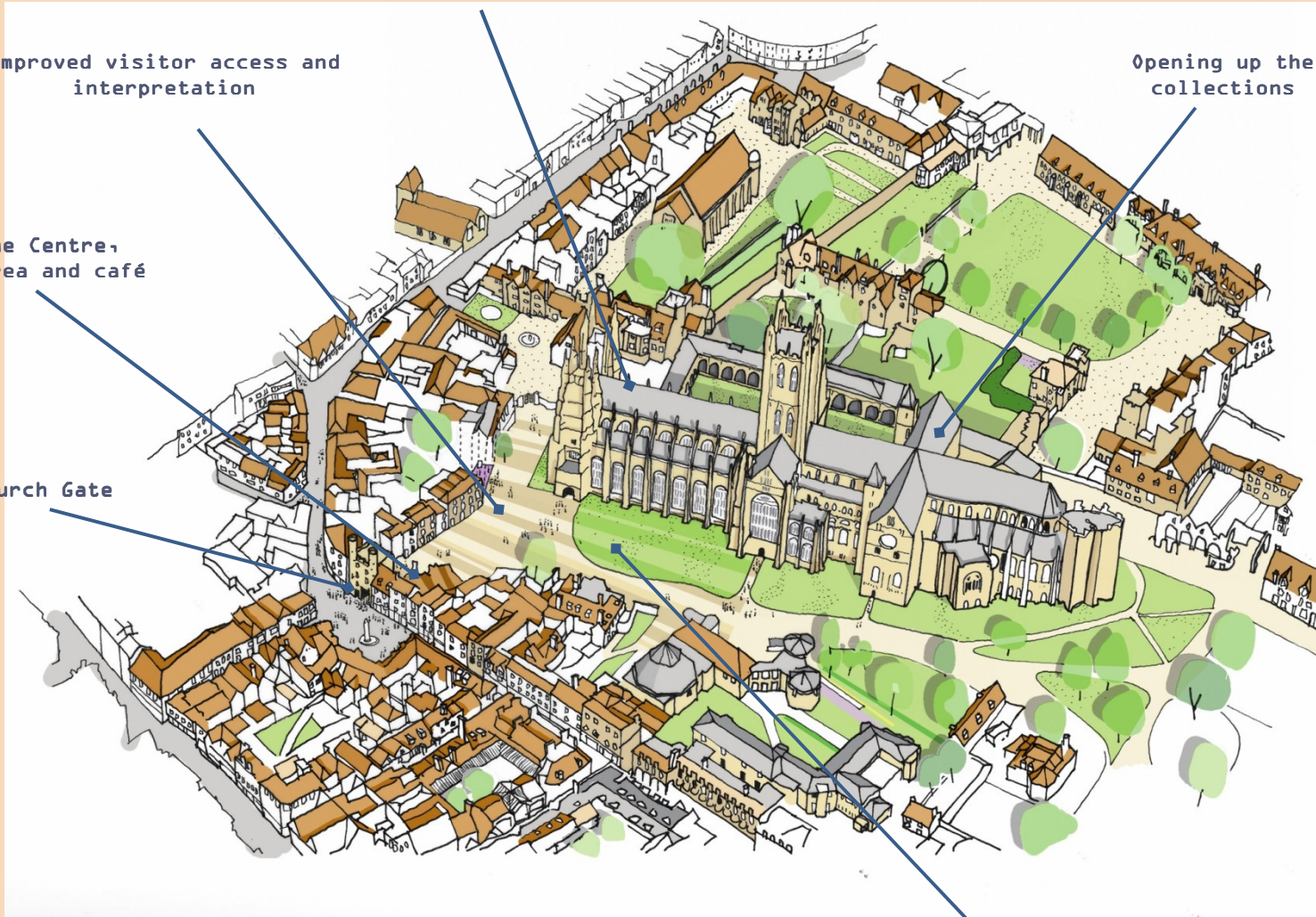

Why now?

- ❖ Deterioration of historic fabric is accelerating, outstripping our piecemeal approach to repairs
- ❖ Interpretation, access and signage are inadequate for the 21st century
- ❖ Our relationship with schools is reactive rather than proactive
- ❖ Our perceived exclusivity must be overcome



Our Journey in recent years

Time for re-evaluation

- ❖ Consultation indicated a need to address how we engage
- ❖ The need for significant repairs became more urgent
- ❖ Initial surveys allowed more detailed costings to understand the scale of the project at hand

Informing and Consulting

- ❖ Workshop with 40 local group representatives
- ❖ Open forums with Cathedral volunteers and staff
- ❖ Meetings with local authorities
- ❖ Public exhibition of landscaping designs
- ❖ Online public survey

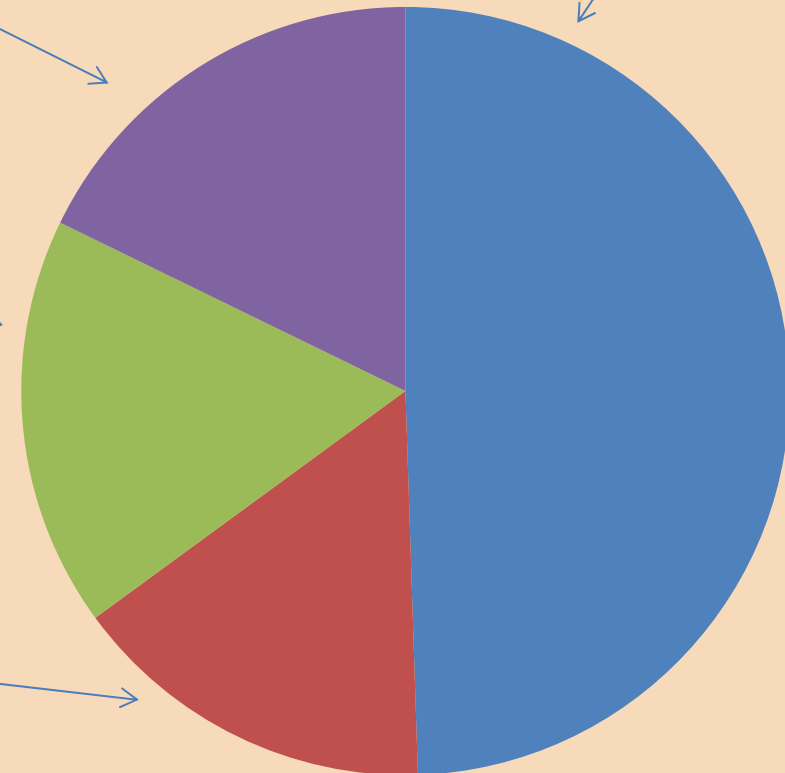

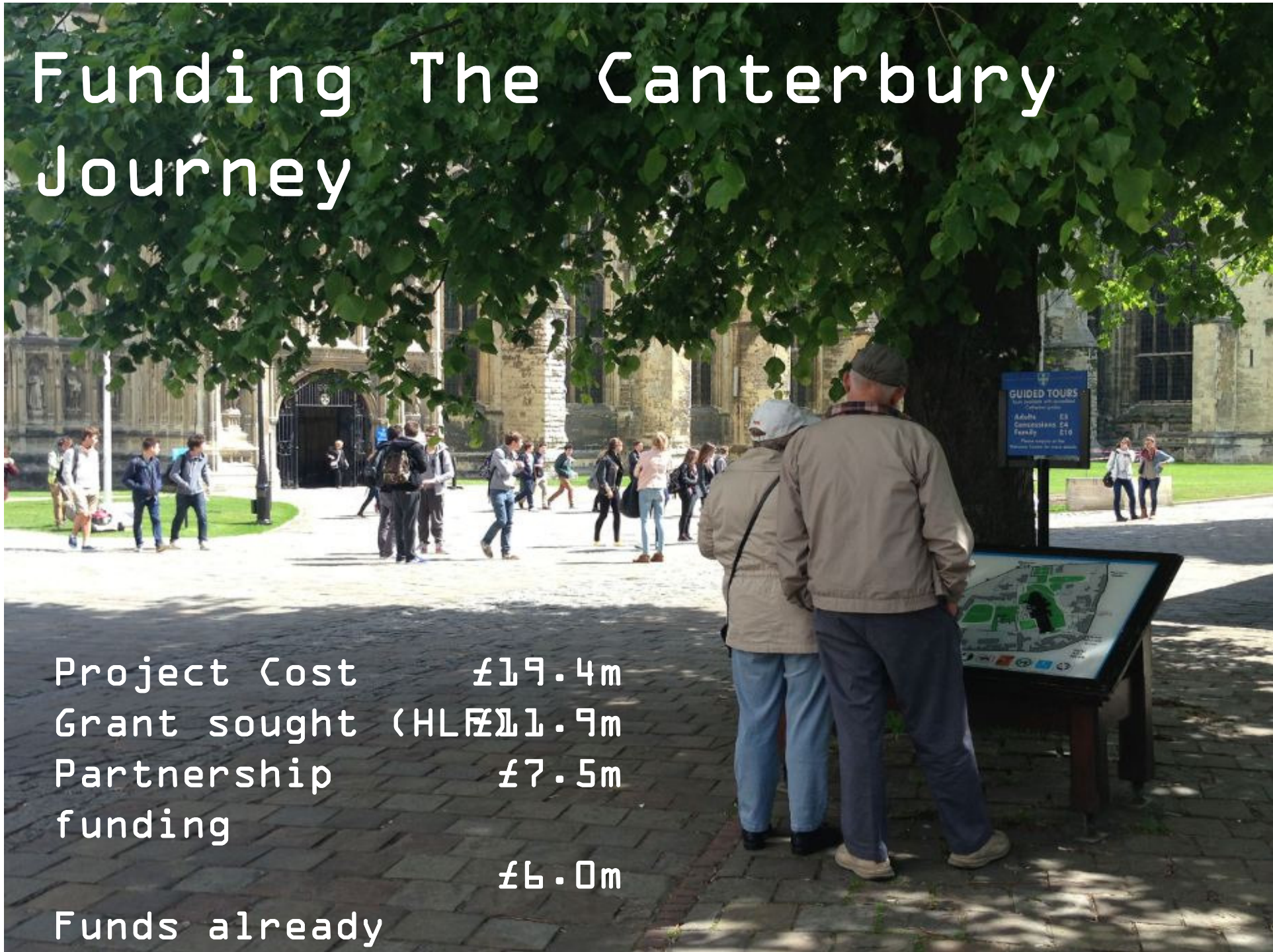
